### [1] Equipment

- Computer.** Mac, Windows. SVSU provides access through computer labs. However, I strongly recommend that you have access to a machine that **you can configure to your needs.** **You cannot complete assignments without access to a full computer. (Chromebooks are not powerful enough.)**
- Microphone + Headphones / Headset.** For creating audio & video elements of design projects.
- Smart Phone / Tablet.** There are many uses for these in class.
- Portable storage device.** Carry an external drive with you for class. Use your SVSU *OneDrive* account for file back up.

### [2] Services

- Dropbox.com.** File sharing. Free account needed.
- Screencast.com.** Video streaming. Free account needed.
- TurboScribe.ai / Otter.ai.** Transcription. Free account needed.
- ChatGPT.** AI. Free account needed. Upgrade at your option.

### [3] Tools & Apps

- Adobe InDesign.** Available in SVSU labs for free. Refer to Syllabus page of course website for additional details.
- Figma.** Free account needed; upgradable to Pro account for free. Refer to Syllabus page on website for additional details. **Figma is optional here, but you need it to access FigJam.** **FigJam.** Digital whiteboard. Comes with your *Figma* account.
- Canva.** Graphic design. Free account convenient.
- Adobe Photoshop.** Available in SVSU labs for free. Refer to Syllabus page of course website for additional details.
- Capture / CapCut / OBS.** Video creation. Free account needed. Students often prefer *CapCut* or *OBS*.
- Google Docs.** Portable workspace. Free account needed.
- Scanning App.** Many free & low-cost options available.
